Exciting news! Due to the success of our recent gala and feedback from docents, I am looking into making a starter instrument pack for our MFMII schools that do not have a resource center or instruments.

This bag or box will belong to MFMII but will be kept at the local school, and will include: remo drums, rhythm sticks, tambourines, maracas, triangles, an 8 note resonator bells set and cymbals. Let me know if you'd like to include anything else.



I am glad to know that the MFMII resource centers are being used by our docents. Please remember to return items to their correct RC and place items back in the closets. Thank you for your co-operation. Please remember that items can be checked out for 2 weeks. If you want to borrow items for longer, please let me know.

I recently bought 30 US stick flags for the **Glenmoor** RC, and also made some small ribbon sticks. Here's **Jaya Murthy**'s comments:

"Veera thanks so much for getting the flags! Am glad not to have to bug Carol to borrow them from Schilling any more. We already marched to "Heart of America" last week and the kids loved it even more with the flags. I have had quite a number of requests for a full set of boomwhackers, so that a whole class can play them at the same time. Since it is impractical to borrow boomwhackers from all the RCs at the same time, to make a class set, we have decided to buy some more boomwhackers (diatonic - C to C), so look out for them shortly at the **Niles** RC.

The past few months have been very busy for our docents. Many docents helped in the preparation of the 25th Anniversary Gala and have been teaching their classes' new songs, music theory and how to perform on stage.

This month, Carol Zilli and I have been busy observing the new docents in their classrooms. If I could describe the new docents with one word, I would say "Amazing". I am so impressed with the professionalism, the rapport with the students, the ability to teach music theory and the curriculum connection that I have seen with these wonderful volunteers.

The veteran docents are hard at work teaching the students music theory; curriculum based songs; and are leading students in performances. The Parkmont students performed on April 12th at their Multicultural Faire. Several of the students even played the ukulele while singing with the other students. It was a fun evening for everyone.

Several teachers have sent in their Mid-Year evaluation and we are pleased with all of the positive comments teachers have said about our docents. Some examples can be seen below:

Jennifer Apy (Azaveda)- "My Music for Minors II docent is meeting and exceeding my expectations. She is doing a great job. She has so much energy when she comes to our class. The children love her." What's Happening at MFMII Schools: Glimpse into Gomes Elementary

The Kindergarten students, led by docents Nicole Cantu and Mark Lichman have been learning music theory such as beat, rhythm, pitch, melody, dynamics, and tempo through fun curriculum and seasonal based songs.

The 1st graders, led by docent Michelle Hertel with assistance from Holly Han, in addition to learning music theory, performed several songs at the PTA Founders Day celebration. The audience couldn't believe how well the children performed and were thoroughly entertained.

The 3rd graders, led by docent Sandy Shimkus have been learning music theory, sign language, playing instruments and recently performed at the MFMII 25th Anniversary Gala. They are also practicing for an assembly that will be performed in June for the entire school. They will be singing and signing songs while demonstrating the music theory that they have learned in the classroom.

The 4th graders, led by docents Chris Schurman and Sandy Shimkus with assistance from Mette Graversen, are hard at work learning the songs and the script for the show: "How the West Was Really Won" that they will be performing in May. One of the 4th grade classes (Mrs. Orr's) has been in a competition with the 3rd graders to see how many rhythm patterns they can clap and say correctly. To date, the 4th graders have been able to correctly match 33 patterns which is a new record for Gomes. The 3rd graders are not far behind with 25-30 correctly matched patterns.

The 5th graders, led by docent Joy Suh with assistance from Mette Graversen, recently performed a musical extravaganza called "Lewis and Clark". This play covers the adventures of these amazing pioneers and is a curriculum connection to what they are studying in history class. Several students worked many hours to perfect their lead roles in the play and the rest of the cast sang and danced and amazed the audience with their abilities.

The 6th graders, led by docent Lelia Ng with assistance from Mette Graversen, are busy practicing the many dances, speaking parts, and singing parts in the play; "Dig It" which is a musical adventure that introduces the ancient civilizations that the students are learning about in their history class. This show is something that every student at Gomes looks forward to being a part of from the time they are in 4th grade. They will be performing in June and the students and parents are looking forward to a memorable evening. None of these performances would be possible without the assistance of all of the docents working together. The teachers and principal are also to be commended for all of their support of the
